I was clutched securely in my tightened seat belt in a pickup and looking at the deployed and collapsed air bags which had broken both sides of the windshield. It was November, in the middle of western Nebraska farmland, it was dark outside, the dome light was on, and the powder from the air bags hung in the air. I had just slammed the truck into a road ditch embankment at a 'T' crossing. A road I had driven many times before.

Immediately feeling my head and finding no blood and not feeling internal injuries...I figured I would survive. My right leg however, had been hard on the brake pedal, and from the grotesque angle of that leg I knew it was badly broken. The intense pain started immediately.

I pulled my cell phone out of my shirt pocket to make an emergency call and realized my glasses were either knocked off in the collision or blown off by the air bags. I couldn't read to dial the phone. I collected my thoughts and decided to dial by 'feel'.

It was then that I heard the voice "This is On-Star". I had two simultaneous thoughts: "God is

talking to me out of the darkness" and "I didn't know my nephew Mike has On-Star in this truck." I replied to the voice from nowhere..."Yes I can talk to you, but I don't know for how long."

Needless to say, the operator contacted rescue units, and stayed on the phone till the Perkins County Sheriff's Department arrived a few minutes later. A couple more minutes and more of my heroes arrived from the Perkins County Rescue Service with an ambulance.

It's no easy task to take a fat boy like me....put a splint on a broken leg, strap him onto a backboard, put a neck brace on him and lift him down out of a pickup that was bridging the road ditch. They loaded me yelling, (and apologizing for yelling), into the ambulance for a trip to the Grant Nebraska Hospital.

At the hospital they struggled to get x-rays, then a cat-scan that told them the trauma in the leg was too great for them to deal with there. You guessed it....back into the ambulance with a nurse added to the rescue guys for a seventy mile trip to North Platte and a larger hospital.

## Acres Green Elementary News

Acres Green resident Phyllis Harvey, recently met with 4th, 5th and 6th grade students at Acres Green Elementary School during their Responsible Ethical Citizenship class to talk about Internet safety. Students learned what they can do to be safe while on the Internet. Topics covered included creating safe email addresses and passwords, protecting personal information, social networking regulations, being aware of potential dangers in downloads, pop-ups and surveys, the importance of talking with their families about setting rules and guidelines for Internet usage at home, and what to do if they are contacted by someone they do not know or if they encounter content that makes them feel uncomfortable. Knowing who we invite into our homes through the Internet is just as important as knowing who we invite into our homes through the front door.

Students will receive more in-depth cyber safety education, along with other topics such as teen relations, and substance abuse, through the Youth Education and Safety in Schools (Y.E.S.S.) program in middle and high school.

Harvey is the youth education program coordinator for the Douglas County Sheriff's Office's and coordinates the Y.E.S.S. program to middle and high school students in the Douglas County School District. ## Parkland Stewards Don't Dump

South Suburban Parks and Recreation appreciates residents' efforts in being responsible stewards of public parkland. Much of the developed and undeveloped public parkland in your neighborhood is managed by South Suburban and contributes to property values aesthetically, ecologically, economically, educationally and recreationally. However, if this public parkland is compromised through irresponsible and potentially illegal activities a loss is experienced by the entire community.

Two of the most common types of irresponsible/illegal activities are unauthorized **encroachments and dumping** of landscape debris and trash. Encroachments include any unofficial modification of public land for personal use, essentially, the "taking" of land.

Examples of encroachment are unauthorized digging, mowing, planting and construction of retaining walls, decks, tables, bridges, irrigation lines and fence extensions.

Violators may be issued summons and are often ordered to remove or correct such plantings and/or structures at their own personal expense. Illegal dumping includes dirt, landscaping rock, bricks, cinder blocks, leaves, branches, logs and other woody debris. Other violations

include storing building/fencing materials or other belongings in public open spaces.

All these activities create taxpayer costs for clean up and restoration, generate issues of legal liability, produce structures that may be a public safety hazard or impede water flow, promote the spread of noxious weeds, cause erosion and damage wildlife habitat.

Please remember to always be a good parkland neighbor and responsibly use our valuable public resources.

## Take Pride in Your Community Apply for South Suburban's Matching Gift Program

South Suburban Parks and Recreation's Board of Directors has allocated **\$10,000 for its annual Matching Gifts Program**. This program matches donated dollars with District funds, resulting in double the money available for the development and improvement of community parks, trails, facilities and programs.

Neighborhoods, homeowner associations, sports groups, businesses, service clubs, individuals and other community organizations are encouraged to make an application for matching funds to complete their community projects on District-owned or leased property. Applications for \$2,000 or less are more likely to be approved for funding. The District is accepting Matching Gift applications for tree plantings and landscape improvements and will continue a water conservation program in conformance with any watering restrictions that may arise in Spring 2010.

**Requests must be submitted by Friday, March 12, 2010**, and it is preferred that the funding match be in dollars, but consideration will be given for documented in-kind services. The list of funded projects will be announced at the Wednesday, April 14, 2010 South Suburban Board meeting. Projects must be completed by December 31, 2010 including all final billings and reimbursements.

My wonderful wife Evie was there the whole time of course. After a week, my family brought me back to Denver for three weeks in a rehab center, then home to more rehab that will last for another six weeks.

What would have happened without On-Star? I would have been ok anyway in this case, because the rest of the great harvest crew knew where I was, and as soon as I didn't show up at the cornfield they came to look for me. Field radios filled the air and the rest of the crew arrived in minutes. Never-the-less, that voice in the night was extremely comforting.

Always wear a seat belt.....Pay close attention to your driving no matter where you are,.....thank God and his heroes out there....and ---On-Star is a great traveling companion.

# On-line Crime Alerting and Mapping service

Provided by the Douglas County Sheriff's office

The Douglas County Sheriff's Office and [CrimeReports.com](http://CrimeReports.com) have announced a new On-line Crime Alerting and Mapping service that provides easy to read incident crime maps and automated alerts to the citizens of unincorporated Douglas County. This service can be accessed directly from the Sheriff's Office Web Site: [www.dcsheriff.net](http://www.dcsheriff.net) provides neighborhood crime data in near real-time.

This service is free to the public and allows citizens to receive automatic daily, weekly or monthly e-mail alerts if/when crimes occur near their home, office, local school, etc.

Crime data is updated nightly and includes the following: incident type, date, location, distance from citizen's address, event identification/case number, brief description of the crime.

After going to the Sheriff's web site, select "CrimeReports.com" go to the "Home" page select "Citizen Crime Alerts." You will be asked to set up your account. You must give the address that you want to be on your crime alert notification, such as your home or local school. You will be asked for your e-mail address and you will establish a password. The software will verify the address you enter and ask you how often you want to receive a report (daily, weekly or monthly).
