What is in a name?

That which we call Acres Green . . .

Well it is not quite Shakespeare, but there truly may be something in a name—**more taxes!** At the last home owners meeting a long time resident brought to our attention that more and more mail is coming through with Lone Tree as our city identification due to the zip code that we share.

Why should you care? According to a report from the Congressional Research Service, the city designation on your mailing address can have an **effect on insurance rates, sales taxes, jury duty notices, housing values and even emergency services.**

Acres Green is in unincorporated Douglas County as such, the

sales tax on items coming to our homes (autos, building supplies, appliances, etc.) should be taxed at the rate of 5 %. This is based on the following sales taxes: state tax 2.9%, Douglas County 1%, RTD 1% and CD (Cultural & Scientific District) .10%. Acres Green is excluded from the Football Stadium tax.

Contrast that to the City of **Lone Tree tax** for the area in its original boundaries of **6.81% and 6.9125%** for the annexed area.

Then there is the City of Littleton sales tax which is 8.10%. Even the neighboring community of Highlands Ranch pays a slightly higher sales tax of

5.1% because they are included in the Football Stadium tax.

So why has our mailing address been Littleton for the past 30 years? Acres Green was the first subdivision in this area of northern Douglas County and the post office that served us was the main office in Littleton. It was many years before the Highlands Ranch post office was even built.

So why does Highlands Ranch have the privilege of using their community name in the city portion of their mailing address even though they are also unincorporated? The post office has allowed them to us their identity in the city portion of their address for many years due primarily to the size of their community, at least that is what we are being told by postal

officials.

The same resident who brought this to our attention has asked postal authorities that we be given authorization to use "Acres Green" as our identifier city, but so far the post office officials have not authorized that.

Of course there is nothing preventing us from using something other than Littleton as the city as long as the zip code is correct — I've seen Highlands Ranch and Lone Tree both used on mail coming into the community.

The problem comes in when dealing with purchases coming into the community—there we need to be sure to identify ourselves as Littleton outside the FD or unincorporated Douglas County in the RTD and CD.

Other things we need to be

aware of are how our insurance rates are calculated and if our property taxes are being affected. Some residents are seeing their license renewal notices using Lone Tree as the city.

So far we have not seen an issue with emergency services, but have noticed that some people are confused about what jurisdiction they are in when it comes to voting.

We understand there is a way for each household, street or community to have their preferred city designation identified with the post office. Once we have the details on that information we will post it on the new website and publish it in upcoming newsletters.

I hope this helps clear some things up and does not muddy the waters even more.



AGHOA Meeting Highlights

The last meeting of the AG-HOA was held on April 15th at the South Metro Fire Station. The first order of business was to discuss upcoming social events which include the neighborhood garage sales on June 4th and 5th and the Acres Green children's parade, which will be held on Sat. July 3rd at 10 a.m. The parade will start at Altair Park again and end at Lonesome Pine park again this year.

Karen has reserved a clown that usually works at the Lone Tree festivities, but she is available for the 3rd. Karen is looking to have ice cream again from Schwans. The Lone Tree's fireworks are still scheduled for July 4th at Sweetwater with required wrist bands.

Ron mentioned that we were sent a notice of a proposed zoning request to allow medical marijuana facilities in Douglas County. It is important to note that the zoning request would not allow those facilities in our community.

Ron further updated us on road improvement projects including those in the Ridgeway area. Sandy sent the in the Treasurer's report. There were only two transactions since the last meeting.

Kathy brought in the Adult

Connection catalog from South Suburban which has several opportunities for adults not just seniors. Kathy also mentioned that the Koebel Library is recommending that people call and make a reservation for upcoming events. They have become so popular that they are running out of space.

Karen mentioned that we had 10 new home owners in the community since February. She brought packages for those present who would like to help deliver them to neighbors. Karen also mentioned that our home prices seem to be quite stable. Even with that good news we had notices for 3 foreclosures in recent weeks.

We received several notices about upcoming events in the county. Among those were a Centennial Airport round table to identify noisy aircraft on May 5th; a fund raiser to put lifesaving masks for dogs on every fire truck in Douglas County: a job academy for youth 14-17 and free mulch available in the county.

Voting for the primary will be an all mail-in ballot. Ron mentioned the number of registered voters in the county. Voters Registered as of 5/4/2010: Democratic:

40,455, Republican: 88,909, Other: 58,805, Total: 188,169

Karen mentioned that Metrum Credit Union was having a workshop on money management for grade school children. She also mentioned an Open House and barbeque on May 1. Metrum also scheduled a company to shred documents and someone giving gardening demonstrations.

Ron next introduced Matt Fierro and David Ponzi, of Fierro Designs, who have been working on the new Acres Green website and debuted the website at this meeting. Everyone who previewed it before the meeting was impressed.

The design is very well laid out and quite a bit of information is available regarding the community. There is also a calendar and several links to areas of interest to our residents.

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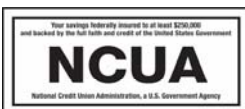

go through an administrator.

In new business the issue of the city designation on our recent mailings being changed to default to Lone Tree, was brought up by a long time resident in the community, John LeMoine.

The main **issue is one of being charged higher taxes.** Some have even been seeing their car registration addressed as the city of Lone Tree. John contacted Chris Boyd who is in charge of Douglas County mailing and who interfaces with the Post Office regarding mailings. She mentioned that the city of Lone Tree has requested and was granted that they be the default city for the zip code of 80124, although **Littleton is still an appropriate designation.**

John mentioned that there is a way to petition the post office by address or by street. Signatures of residents are required to change the preferred designation. John is doing more research on how we can make this easier on people to make their preferred designation. (See additional information on pg 1.)

We adjourned at 9 p.m. It was a lively meeting!

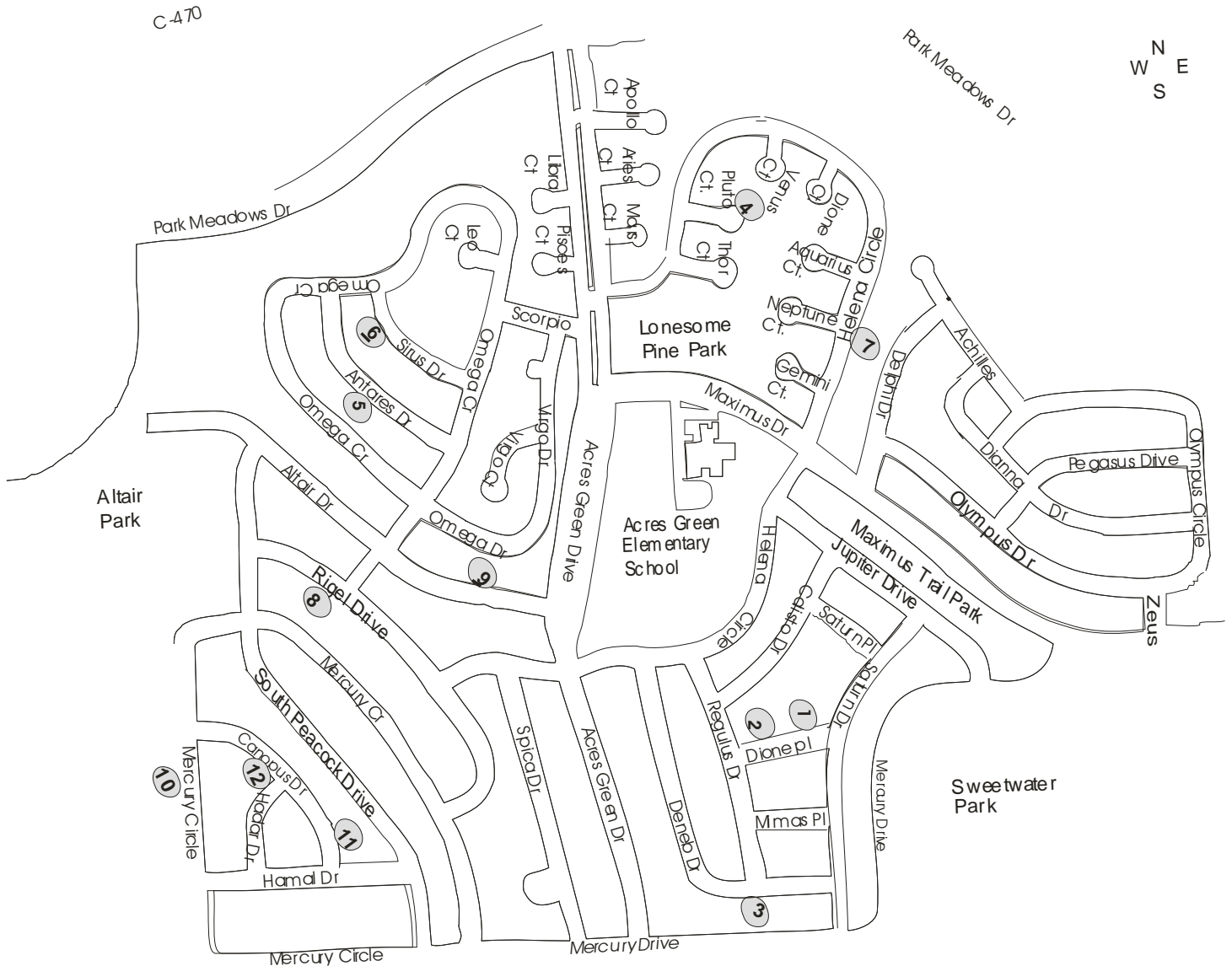

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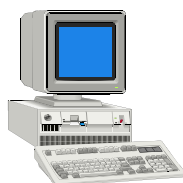
