25 miles per hour that is when I am driving within Acres Green. 25 mph is the maximum limit established for our residential area. And, I am here now, along with many of my neighbors and friends, asking that you make 25 mph your limit as well.

As you are reading this newsletter, the school year has just ended for summer. This means that more kids will be out and about walking, playing and on their bikes-being kids. They will not be watching for you in your car- you need to be watching for them.

According to walkinginfo.org, higher speed crashes are much

more lethal to pedestrians, with an 85 percent chance of a fatal injury to a pedestrian at 40 mph compared to a 5 percent chance of a fatality at 20 mph. When was the last time you glanced down and noticed you were going between 30 and 40 mph in Acres Green?

Please be aware and slow down.

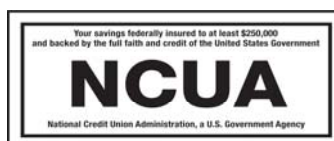

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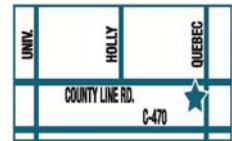

Virgo Botanic Gardens

"We saw it, we liked the looks and smell of it, so we bought it....it's Dwarf Curry." The curry plant sits in one of dozens of pots and spots at the home of Lee Barrie and Kristen Diehle who live in our cul-de-sac. The acquisition is typical of the way these two purchase exotic or unusual plants in abundance all around their yard.

Lee has lived here about fifteen years and Kris about five. Lee hails from Texas and Kansas City, and is a small business owner. His company tests and balances HVAC and water flows in large buildings. Kris is a Denver native retired from Albertson's Corporation. The two spend part of their time fishing the bays of Florida and some western fishing holes. Lee says they like to travel "everywhere west of the Mississippi". He does some hunting as well, but even a short visit to their home says they spend a whole lot of time in the yard.

The house sits at the perfect angle for proper sunlight to grow things. While I struggle to find enough sun to grow dahlias, just up the street these folks plant a dozen and roduce gorgeous blooms all season long. One favorite, 'Lavender Ruffles', is stunning in size and beauty.

Through all seasons this yard is fascinating. There are so many things to enjoy I can't describe them all. We have a miniature Botanic Gardens right here in the neighborhood....carefully tended and beautiful.

I chatted with Kris and Lee sitting in wicker furniture on their

large flagstone patio. In the center is a really heavy flagstone table. Sitting on the table is a Citronella plant, and beside it are the twisted, curly stems of a Contorted Filbert plant. In and around the lush lawn beside us are a Catulpa tree, a Wisteria and a Magnolia, a Crabapple tree that was frostbitten this spring, raspberries and blackberries that produce golf ball sized fruit, a Butterfly Bush and a Burning Bush that is brilliant red in the fall. Ooops I didn't mention the complex little cactus garden right behind me that I think is one of Lee's favorite spots. As we talked plants, Kris would open the zip-lock bag on her lap and sort through the many dozens of tags she's saved from the nursery pots to find the picture and name of a particular treasure.

A whimsical frog and a gecko are perched on the side of the house, and below them is a running fountain that Kris tries to keep two grandkids out of.....sure...good luck with that Gramma. Close by the bright red Gazania blossom are ceramic and brass toadstools, a gazing ball, and a variety of other tasteful garden decorations to hold your attention till all these plants burst into bloom.

Around the left of the house is a quiet hosta and fern shade garden sitting under a tree. Leading to that garden is a well sculpted flagstone walkway and lock landscaping that replaced the old concrete we see all over Acres Green. There's a whole lot of love and really hard labor in the transformation of this front yard. These folks are very familiar with sledge

hammers and wheel barrows and digging in the dirt. The front lawn is rimmed with tall Pampas grass, and dahlias and a myriad of other plants. It truly is a study in variety.

Go into the backyard and you'll find a steeply terraced creation. Off the deck are several levels buttressed with landscaping locks. The future 15'X20' pond is a work in progress, and will be a great feature when finished. Kris says the retaining walls were a joint effort...Lee laid the blocks, and she packed a whole lot of dirt behind them. I get tired just thinking about it.

Spread throughout the backyard are five cherry trees, three apple trees, and plum tree, and a peach tree. Lee says their three dogs love peaches and lay under the tree waiting for the ripe fruit to drop. Lee laughs too as he tells about the neighbor kids chatting and chomping on the ripe grapes hanging over the back fence. If they eat them he doesn't have to pick them. They can have the grapes, I'm going over to join the dogs this summer.

On one of the terraces sits the veggie garden with tomatoes, lettuce, cucumbers, corn, and beets and such, and over against the house is a nice size rhubarb patch that supplies my wife Evie and other neighbors with the makings of rhubarb pies and jam.

We also benefited from the Jerusalem Artichokes Kris brought to our house this spring. I'd never seen the things before, but Kris told me to cook them like potatoes, so of course I did the healthy

thing and deep fried them....they are delicious. Kris also supplied me with extras for seed so now I'll plant my own. The tubers came from the backyard adjacent the Hops vines that are rampaging over the back fence...near the grapevines where the kids stop by for a snack.

There's a whole lot more here we haven't even talked about, but I'll stop now before this little writing turns into a Nursery catalog. We're glad to have Kris and Lee as great gardeners and generous neighbors. I learn more about horticulture from them every year.

AGHOA Meeting Highlights

The last AGHOA meeting was held April 18 at the South Metro Fire Station on Maximus Dr. Before the meeting Walt Barnard mentioned he is selling all his woodworking tools. He is offering them to Acres Green residents before the garage sale date. Please see his listing on our Nextdoor.com site for more information.

Jean reported on updates to the Nextdoor.com site. They are proposing to once again allow posting to other nearby neighborhoods. They are collecting feedback regarding that "feature" now before implementing. Jean will keep us updated.

The next order of business was the Treasurer's report and a discussion regarding the renewal of our CD. Sandy's report indicated that dues collected for 2012 was \$2,765.09. Expenses were \$2,146.05 which included Xcel Energy, delivery of the Greenleaf, website domain registration, front garden expenses, donations and other misc. items. Available funds to date were \$786.44.

It was decided to split the CD which consisted of \$2,873.64 into two, renewing 1/2 for 6 months and the other half for 1 year. That will give us more flexibility should we need to draw on that money for any expenses or a future matching gifts request.

The next topic was membership. Alyce provided a list of current members which totaled 102 families. This is just under 10%.

Next we discussed the white paper Jean put together regarding the history of the neighborhood and the AGHOA. Everyone who read the paper liked it. There were some typos, so Jean is sending the paper to Karen for editing. Then it will be posted to the Nextdoor site for anyone in the community to read. Pat wants to use the amended white paper to encourage people to join the association.

Pat mentioned that the C-470 group is still trying to figure out how to pay for the highway improvements.

Pat also looked into the watering restrictions. Acres Green is in the Denver Water District. Annuals and

vegetables may be watered on any day with a hand-held hose or drip irrigation.

Residents are encouraged to wash their vehicles on their designated watering days. For residential watering addresses ending in odd numbers can water on Wednesdays and Saturdays. Those whose addresses end in even numbers can water on Thursdays and Sundays. Watering must be done between the hours of 6 p.m. and 10 a.m. Fines can be levied by the Denver Water District for violating these restrictions.

Pat also mentioned that Lone Tree is accepting bids for the replacement of Park Meadows Drive. It is expected that the reconstruction will begin this summer.

Jean mentioned that there were several comments regarding speeding and running stop signs in the neighborhood recently on Nextdoor.com. The suggestion was to ask a deputy to come to our June meeting to discuss the topic.

Lenora mentioned that there was graffiti on the culvert off of Maxi-
